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Our Mission

Resilience Healthcare is a wholly Irish owned health and social care provider. In 2023, through the provision of residential day and community based services, we supported 300 people with Autism, Prader Willi Syndrome, intellectual, physical and sensory disabilities.

Through our Advanced Community Care Division, we provided home Nursing Services to 110 children and adults with complex medical needs and their families.

Gender balance

Gender balance on leadership team 80% female vs 20% male. Plus we have a 70% female Senior Management Team, far exceeding the national average of 36% (Grant Thornton's annual Women in Business Report).



Person Centred Services

We continued to expand our range of quality person centred services, underpinned by operational and clinical excellence.

Outreach & Day Services

In 2023, we supported 130 people through our Outreach Services and 80 people attended our Day Services. We provide outcome focused individualised supports, growing our Day Services in line with the 'Interim Standards for New Directions Services' to encourage self-determination in the lives of people with disabilities. In partnership with the HSE we were pleased to open our 8th Day Service in Swords, Dublin at the end of 2023.





Clinical Services Team

The CST delivered in-person training to 582 employees in 2023. 327 employees received a 2-day training event across 7 locations that focused on Intellectual Disability, Autism, Human Rights, Positive Behaviour Support, Quality of Life Measures, Individual Service Plans and Person Centred Planning.

An additional 255 employees received initial and refresher Safety Intervention training from the Behaviour Support Specialists. Other service user specific training included Trauma Informed Care, PWS, Sensory and Emotional Regulation, Feeding-Eating-Drinking-Swallowing (FEDs), Positive Behaviour Support Plans, Sleep Hygiene, Incontinence, Scatolia, and Critical Incident Debrief sessions.

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Residential Services

We opened two new residential services in 2023. This included the expansion of our Shared Care Service Model with a new home for children in Kilkenny.

We expanded our specialist services for people with PWS by opening four new apartments at Rose Lodge, Kildare and were successful in the tender to open a national PWS specialist respite service planned for 2024.

Advanced Community Care

Year on year, the number of children and adults with complex medical needs we support in the community continues to grow. We grew by 12% in 2023 and were supporting 110 clients in the community (versus 98 in 2022). The majority of these services are via the HSE paediatric tender framework for the provision of homecare services to children with complex healthcare needs.



Person Centred Services

Governance & Risk Management

Resilience Healthcare's governance and risk management are indispensable for the successful operation of our business. They ensure the delivery of safe, high-quality care, compliance with legal and regulatory standards, and the overall sustainability of the business.

We continue to foster a culture of continuous improvement and in line with best practice we have an established oversight Governance Committee that has met every quarter and overseen all aspects of our clinical governance and risk management. In turn this has been scrutinized by the Board Committee on Quality and Risk which met every quarter.

Governance and Risk Management continues to mature across the business and in 2023 we commissioned an external assessment of Environmental, Social, and Governance compliance to which we were recognised as being of a high standard.

92% compliance rate

In 2023, Resilience Healthcare attained 92% compliance rate across all aspects of HIQA inspections.

EFQM 5-Star & ISO 45001 Accreditation

In 2023, Resilience Healthcare was awarded the distinction of being the first company in the Republic of Ireland to receive 5 stars under the newer and in-depth scoring system implemented by EFQM since 2020. EFQM is an international accreditation that helps businesses perform better, by benchmarking their performance against best practice from top companies across multiple industries around the world. This recognition highlights our commitment to excellence and superior quality in health and social care delivery.

In November 2022 Resilience Healthcare achieved certification in the International Standard (ISO) 45001 the Occupational Health & Safety Management System. Our people are an important stakeholder and this accreditation demonstrates our commitment to the safety and welfare of employees, visitors, and contractors. After undertaking further audit in 2023, we sustained our compliance with this standard.











Initiatives

Through Broadlake, our parent company, we have undertaken several initiatives to enhance diversity, equity, and inclusion within its workforce. These include developing a strategic plan and registering all companies under the Open Doors Initiative. Additionally, the company organised events such as Pride, 'Wear it Purple' Day and sponsored the GALAS LGBTQ+ Awards. New policies and procedures have been developed, along with plans for Unconscious Bias training across all companies. The Broadlake Company's efforts were recognised with a finalist position in the Employee Resource Group Award.

Work. Earn. Learn.

This initiative is for anyone who is looking to start a career in Disability Services or to completely change their career path. Joining us as an Assistant Support Worker, they are fully-funded by Resilience Healthcare in obtaining a relevant QQI Level 5 healthcare qualification, to be completed within 1 year of commencing employment. This is available as a 20 hour or full-time contract.

Innovation Hub

We launched our Innovation Hub and presented Innovation Awards to teams under the categories of Inclusive Technology, Health & Wellbeing, Environmental Impact, Community Empowerment and Community Impact.

Information Evenings

We held three information evenings for families of school leavers with additional needs to promote and present our Day Services in Naas, New Ross, and Listowel. The HSE collaborated and presented with us on two of them.






Down Syndrome Ireland

2023 saw the following in relation to our environmental impact:



Solar PV

Our first installation of a Solar PV array in Hillview, Co. Kilkenny, generating electricity for the property, water heating and over 1000kWh surplus electricity exported back to the ESB network for a financial credit.



Audit

Energy & carbon audited completed. We now have targets of 38% energy reduction and 37% carbon reduction by 2030.



Strategy

Preparation of our Energy & Carbon Reduction Strategy for implementation in 2024.



Systems

Tendering of Energy Monitoring Systems for residential properties for installation in 2024.



Waste Reduction

Monitoring of all waste generated at house level commenced with EU targets for reduction by 2030 identified. Reduction goals of 55% for general waste, 60% for recycled waste by 2025, while ensuring we also have 100% compost waste collection across our network of houses.



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Biodiversity

In 2023 we commenced our Biodiversity plan which includes creating wild-flower gardens and rollout of bee hotels and bird feeders in all of our homes.
